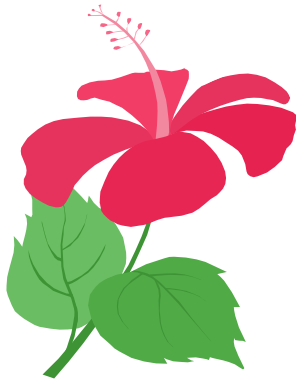

Southern Union Women's Conference

I'm so excited to share more news with you. I was privileged to participate in the Southern Union Women's Conference at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Atlanta, GA, September 4-7, 2008. The Southern Union consists of churches from Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee.

During the early Sabbath morning program, I sang "I Bowed on My Knees and Cried Holy". This was by far one of the most exciting opportunities of my music ministry.

There were between 1800—2000 women at the conference. Before attending, I had been promised to be "inspired, encouraged, and challenged by dynamic speakers, outstanding music, and intensive prayer time." Not only did this conference meet those expectations, but it actually exceeded them.

The theme was "One Voice, One Vision", and the featured speakers were Ginny Allen, Deborah Harris, Jo Ann Davidson, Dick Stenbakken, and Raquel Arrais. Gale Jones Murphy and Valerie "Tyger" Hazlett were featured guests and they were awesome.

We were truly blessed as we participated in seminars that helped us grow in our prayer life and our Christian walk in general. We were

encouraged to experience God's power in our daily lives as we listened to each message. The speakers were nothing less than dynamic and the music enhanced the experience.

During the conference, the God in Shoes Outreach Ministry worked with local agencies to organize a huge community outreach effort. A large number of women attending the conference traveled on buses with the God in Shoes ministry and visited two women's shelters, a men's shelter, and a group of children at a hospital. During that time they gave away 400 pairs of shoes, treated the women to a day spa, distributed care bags, and sang songs at the shelters. They also shared a clown ministry with the children in the hospital. Upon returning to the hotel, some of the women continued singing as they came into the lobby. Some of the staff and guests sang along with them. It was truly a sight to see.

The days were long and every minute seemed to be accounted for, but the conference was a very enjoyable experience. Besides the actual planned activities, my most memorable experiences had to be when I had a chance to meet other ministers of music. I was honored to meet and talk to Gale Jones Murphy, Doris DeHaney, Natasha

Perez, and Emily Felts Jones while at the conference. Gale Jones Murphy was the featured musician and singer. She played and sang for each program, and she also wrote the wonderful theme song, "One Voice, One Vision", especially for this occasion. All of the above-named ladies are truly gifted and diverse. They each touched our hearts with their ministries, and I pray that God will continue to bless them as they continue to do his will. I am so happy to have met each of them. We have exchanged music and contact information so that we will be able to keep in touch. All I can tell you is that if you are ever in an area where either of these ladies is sharing her gift in song, you don't want to miss it. Be there! I am happy to announce that each of these ladies has CDs available that would make wonderful additions to your inspirational music collection. The Southern Union Women's Conference not only allowed me the opportunity to reunite with longtime Christian friends, but to also make new ones in a spirit of love and fellowship. September 27, 2008, was a very special day for my ministry and me. On that date, I returned home and gave my first concert in Yazoo City, Mississippi, since releasing my debut CD.

Yazoo City will always have a special place in my heart. My father and I moved there when I was around 2 years old. This was shortly after my mother had lost her battle with leukemia. It was a new beginning with the loss of his wife, and the situation was filled with uncertainty.

Nevertheless, God had a plan. My father remarried, and his wife, Bettye, legally adopted me. My mother, her family, and the church have all treated me exceptionally well and I will never forget it. Therefore, being able to go home and give a concert was so special that I can hardly describe it.

I am truly grateful to Pastor Stephen L. Gates and Elder Charlie Strong for spearheading this event. I would also like to thank the *Yazoo Herald* for their continued support. They have actually printed articles about my ministry and me on the front page of their paper twice, and, for that I am sincerely appreciative.

I would also like to express my gratitude to all of my family and friends who took time out of their busy schedules to

attend, especially my grandmother whom I affectionately call "Ms. Muh".

The service began with inspirational songs of praise from Chilala Watson, and special words of encouragement from Pastor Stephen Gates. I must say that Pastor Gates has been an asset to my ministry, and my feeble words alone are inadequate to convey my appreciation for all of the time and effort that he devoted to make the program a success.

After Pastor Gates and Mr. Watson set the tone, my mother opened the service with a song that had been requested by my husband, Michael. Michael had told her that if I ever did a concert in Yazoo City, he would love for her to sing "I Am Redeemed". I was totally shocked to hear it, but I was also very pleased. It was an excellent choice.

Mrs. Esther Cuffie then opened with one of her beautiful original songs. Mrs. Cuffie has literally known me all of my life. Since she was the pastor's wife of the church in Indianola, the town where I was born, Mrs. Cuffie knew my biological mother. She held

me as a baby and Mrs. Cuffie was also there when my biological mother passed away. She said that it was an honor to be on the program. After listening to her sing, I honestly can't wait to attend one of her concerts. Mrs. Cuffie is truly anointed and her music has inspired countless others throughout the years.

Before I presented my ministry the final person on the program was international recording artist Cynthia Palmer. She too shared her original message of hope. As soon as she hit the first note, I felt as if I were attending a wonderful mini-concert from two dynamic singers. Both artists shared words of encouragement with me before, during, and after their songs.

Until that evening, I had never met Mrs. Palmer. However, I had recently ordered some of her CDs. This past summer, Adria Ware let me hear some of Mrs. Palmer's music, and I was extremely impressed. Shortly thereafter, I purchased one of her CDs, but I eventually ended up with several of them. I would have never imagined that her concerts would be even better, but that is certainly the case. It was truly an honor to have her come and share her ministry with us!
